Core Truths

"What are the three spiritual truths you want your child to know before they reach the age of 18?"

That was the question posed by the Rev. Traci Smith during a Zoom webinar I attended with her in late February. She gave us a couple of minutes to reflect and write down our responses. Afterwards, she shared her three spiritual truths that she hopes her kids will know (which may be different than yours, and that's totally fine!):

- that God loves you unconditionally;
- that everyone is made in the image of God; and
- that Jesus commands you to love God and to love your neighbors as yourselves.

She then shared some very practical ideas of how we could communicate our most important spiritual truths to our loved ones. One idea was a sticker chart. Now, some families have a sticker chart and kids "earn" a sticker when they do a chore or when they are successful in being pottytrained, etc. But Smith's idea was having a big chart with

every day of the week listed and, at the end of each day, a sticker is placed next to that day. Whether it had been a good day or a bad day, the child got a sticker — a signal of unconditional love: you are alive, you are here, and you belong to this family. Gold star!

I love this idea because I often live as if God's love is conditional, that I need to have a "good day" in order to merit a gold star sticker. Although I haven't gotten out an actual sticker chart out for myself, I'm grateful that I have this image of a sticker chart to meditate on these days: whether I was productive or not today. whether I was well-behaved or not today, this does not change God's disposition towards me. God is saying, "I love you. You belong to me. Rest in my favor which you cannot earn.'

I pray that you also can find rest in the knowledge that God loves you unconditionally and that you can extend that unconditional love to all those who God has entrusted to you!
