Symbolism in the PC(USA) Seal and in our Pentecost Banners

The seal of the Presbyterian Church (USA), pictured below, is actually a registered trademark. The seal contains symbols of the cross, scripture, a descending dove at the upper part of the cross, and flames on either side of the lower part of the cross.

Pentecost Banners are often red (it is the color for liturgical vestments on Pentecost), and they use symbols of fire or flames, as well as a dove.

- Fire. Represents the Holy Spirit, who filled the apostles with enthusiasm, replacing their fear with the courage to go forth and share Christ's story.
 "Tongues of fire ... came to rest on each one of them."
- Red. The color represents the dynamism of the Holy Spirit and the zeal of those whose hearts are opened.
- Dove. Represents the Holy Spirit that descended "like a dove" and hovered over Jesus when he was baptized. It is also a symbol of peace.
