My Journey of Faith

As I reflect on my walk with God, I must say that it has been hard. God has poured so much grace for me since my birth: the blessing of growing up in a Christian home, providing for needs in desperate times, and even education that can lead to a career. Society argues that home, security, and education are more valuable than the simple truth of the Gospel. Because of this, I have occasionally lost myself in

focusing on these things rather than trusting in our God, the One who clothes the lilies of the field and feeds the birds of the skies.

My walk with God developed when I went to college. I stopped going to church because I didn't feel accepted in a church that wasn't Calvin. I justified it by listening to sermons by Pastor Neil in my dorm room. Through this, I realized how lukewarm I was. How much time was I reading the Word of God? How much time did I spend praying (aside from when I would check my bank account in college in hope that the numbers weren't red)? To be honest, it was probably only at church.
