Growing Closer to God

How did you come to know Jesus (and not just know about Him)? Would you like to continue growing?

As a child and teenager, it seemed that a common message from adults was "religion or faith are private matters" — with the unspoken message that religion or faith were *not* topics for discussion with others. While I listened intently to sermons and attended Sunday school classes, without being mentored it was hard to grow in my knowledge of Jesus. And I had no idea what it meant to enter into a real relationship with Jesus, to know Him, rather than to just know about Him.

Fast forward a few decades.... I had listened to many sermons at Calvin and other churches, but

still had many basic questions about God. Thankfully, my wife Darlene and I joined several other people in a small group. This was my first experience in a small group. The other members, who were more mature in their own walks with Jesus than I was, shared considerable love, patience, and nurturing as they helped me understand the answers to my questions about God. This small group experience changed my life as I finally came to know Jesus as my Lord and Savior. I will never be able to thank them enough for their wonderful gift to me.

One of our small group's early studies was Henry Blackaby's Experiencing God: Knowing and Doing the Will of God. God knew what I needed, and this study was it — focusing the discussion through a nurturing small group on knowing God. living in obedience to and in relationship with God, and seeking His will for my life. This was a wonderful departure from "religion and faith are private matters" as our small group members helped me understand more of God's Word and how to apply it to my life, and how to grow in my relationship with God.

I hope that you have had an opportunity like Darlene and I did to be part of a close, loving, nurturing small group. But if not, please consider joining or starting one at Calvin. Plans are being made now for an emphasis on starting new small groups this fall. So please watch this email series for further details over the next several weeks. In the meantime,
