// Financial Stewardship for 2023

These last few years, our world has been upended. In different ways, all of us have been flipped up on edge and left teetering. As we look for ways to return to stability, what if God is inviting us to go forward into something new rather than going back to what was?

Just over two weeks ago, packets were mailed out for "Doing a New Thing: Stewardship for 2023." (If you did not receive one, copies are available at the front desk.) Please review it and prayerfully consider what the LORD may be asking of you for next year regarding the stewardship of the financial resources God has entrusted to you. We would appreciate receiving completed commitment cards by Sunday, November 27; however, you may return them to the church office any time.

Finance Team Update

October has been our best month of the fiscal year so far! Contributions to date are about 84% of what the budget anticipated (a slight increase over last month's giving), and expenses continue to be lighter than we projected (92% of what we expected by the end of October). Even though contributions are not as strong as we had hoped they would be, October giving still managed to

decrease the deficit from September by about \$7,000.

Facilities revenue is the big star this month now that we have some recurring guest users.

Revenue to date is over \$17,000 - \$4,000 more than we had hoped to receive by now.
