A Lesson in Trust

When I was growing up, I always seemed to have faith that God would be there for me. My mom had multiple sclerosis (M.S.) and I watched her live life with courage and grace. When I was in seventh grade, I came home one day and heard a faint cry, "Christi, help!" I found my mother stuck between the toilet and bathtub. The phone was on the counter just out of her reach.

"Mom, what happened? How long have you been stuck?" She had been stuck like that for over eight hours! I tried to pull her loose. She prayed out loud that I would have enough strength to pull her out. I prayed that I would know exactly what to do.

After about five minutes of trying, I determined I was not strong enough and I called my dad. I wanted to panic.

This moment was a defining moment in my life. In my mother, I saw a clear example of trusting God. She knew that He would be there in times of trouble. And He would help guide *me* in difficult moments. He would help me with panic and anxiety. From that day forward, I learned to go to God in times of difficulty or whenever I feel the desire to panic. God helped my mother to face her M.S. with fortitude and trust — I saw that many, many times, but never so clearly as in this particular incident. As I learned to do from my mother, I want to encourage all of you to trust God in times of trouble, fear, or panic.
