Some Are Evangelists, Some Are Gardeners

During this past year's Good Friday service, we walked around the outside of the church and ended up in the courtyard. While I was there, I noticed that the pandemic had taken its toll on the church grounds. As I looked around, I felt this nudge... a quiet whisper, "Lisa, this needs your attention." Now, I do enjoy gardening — but 3 to 4 acres is more than just a simple few hours pulling weeds and planting bulbs in my yard!

So, I thought I'd spend my time getting the courtyard into shape for the staff to look out their windows and enjoy the view. Or they could go out and have a peaceful lunch surrounded by God's beautiful earth. As I was finishing up the courtyard, I was pushed to walk the entire campus and reset my goals. But as I viewed the grounds I told God I couldn't do this by myself. I needed others to help keep me on task and encourage me.

God answered my request as several people in the congregation rose up to work on the grounds and they kept me motivated. Several guys worked on the sprinkler system and enjoyed turning it on in the areas I was working just to cool me off (and maybe they got a giggle out of surprising me with a dousing!).
