Mean What You Pray

In 2001, I was asked to leave the Calvin Youth Ministry in the hands of the new director and take on the robust missions ministry. This would be a new staff position we would define as we went. Youth mission trips had taught me missions from the youth leader perspective, but broader missions work involved the care and support of our many infield missionaries, handling the donated support, and raising awareness of our mission

focus to the congregation. A big learning curve for sure.

As I prayed about this change, God suddenly opened the door for me to travel to Tanzania and live for six weeks, tent camping, at an "orientation training" for Wycliffe SIL missionary families preparing to serve in East Africa. I would travel alone (a first for me and scary!). Be careful when you pray, as I had been doing, that you will serve God "anywhere, anytime, and anything." He takes you up on your offer.

The fear of stepping out in faith was overwhelming. However, every excuse I made He quickly removed until it was very clear that this was God's will and He would provide. Still, in early October 2001, just after 9/11, I prayed my way from Seattle to Dar Es Salam, each travel segment thankfully smoothed and blessed. In Dar, I was met by a friend who put me on the eight hour inland bus to Iringa, TZ. What a comfort to have his help. As the bus arrived after dark at the tent camp, I was met by my host, welcomed, and put at ease.

And so I patiently waited for God to reveal what I was to learn and how I could serve this group. The experience was robust with purpose and insight into what it means to devote one's life to serve God as a missionary. The seasoned training missionaries and incoming families changed and broadened my limited world perspective. I learned so much about the sheer joy of stepping boldly into God's adventure and leaning on Him to see me through.

I returned home, my spirit, mind and heart irrevocably changed, and with a passion for the new task that lay before me as Coordinator of Missions.




NEW MEMBERS
