What Matters Most

As I consider the story of my own faith, there are three moments that come to mind that hold meaning and grace for me, having impacted my life and thinking.

 My father and mother, Wilfred and Edna Blasing, died.

Thereafter a moment occurred in which I found myself experiencing a sense of detachment and disengagement from the world around me, as if simply just observing all things and people, big or small, important or not, meaningful or not, passing by — as all these will come to pass.

 While in high school, I happened to be attending the once Haller Lake Baptist Church during a building fund campaign.

I made a monetary pledge, believing that God can fulfill any pledge through me if He so chooses; to which a team leader expressed his opinion that this was a pledge that I would not be able to fulfill; to which my spontaneous and audible reply was, "My life is not my own."

 At this same Baptist church, around the same early stage of my life, an elder shared with me personally a Bible verse, impacting my thinking to this day:

"Great peace have they who love thy law, and nothing shall offend them." (Psalm 119:165)

Through time and events and people that have come and gone, belief in Christ Jesus has remained and grown and has been sustained through it all. Jesus lives. The Holy Spirit lives. God's gift of grace and mercy and goodness is steadfast and that matters a lot to me.
