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Suggested Questions for Individual  
Study or Group Discussion\*



- How would you define “good”? What makes something or someone good?
- *Read Micah 6:6–8.* Given the context of God’s people being accused of ingratitude and forgetfulness (see 6:1–5), what tone do you detect in this response?
- How do the suggested offerings of appeasement escalate? What is the point of listing these options for canceling or paying for one’s sins?
- What is required by the LORD for a good life? How are these requirements interrelated? What do we often add to these?
- What does it mean to do justice or act justly? How is this enacted in the life of an individual and of a church?
- What does it mean to love mercy or kindness? How is this enacted in the life of an individual and of a church?
- What does it mean to walk humbly with God? How is this enacted in the life of an individual and of a church?
- How do the LORD’s requirements for a good life compare with your own life? In what areas of your life can you continue “to do justice, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God”?
- How can you better follow the LORD’s requirements this week? What are you going to do? How can your small group or others support and pray for you as you do this?
