#### **Kimberly Hurst**

// Today's guest preacher

Joining us in worship today is Kimberly Hurst. Kim is the Northwest Director of Strategic Partnerships at World Relief, a global Christian humanitarian organization that brings sustainable solutions to the world's greatest problems. In her role, Kim develops partnerships among philanthropists, churches, and community leaders in the U.S. and abroad to bring hope, healing, and lasting transformation to the world's most vulnerable people. She holds degrees from the University of Washington and Fuller Theological Seminary. Kim and her husband, Rich, were married at Calvin Church 40 years ago, and Rich served as Calvin's Minister to Singles from 1981 to 1985.

As our series on compassion continues, Kim is joining Pastor Neil to discuss how we show Christ-like compassion to our neighbors who are immigrants, particularly those who are refugees.

#### **Ahinas Visit Today!**

// Fundraising lunch after the service

Byron and Inez Ahina, long-time Calvin members, work with Yucatan Helping Hands in Yucatan, Mexico. Yucatan is a state in the southeastern part of Mexico, a few hours' drive west from Cancun. The Ahinas work in *pueblos*, rural communities where many families live in one-room houses, often with thatched roofs, and sometimes built with walls made of wooden sticks

and plastic bags. Bathrooms, clean water, and daily meals are not always a given. (Pueblo is the Spanish word for "village.")

The Ahinas serve as a liaison between churches and groups from the U.S. and local congregations. They investigate needs and set up necessary arrangements for visiting groups. The aim is to open doors for local and visiting churches to witness and share the good news of Jesus Christ.

Today, the Ahinas are speaking in the worship service about their ministry. Following the service, everyone is invited to the Fellowship Hall for an informational and fundraising lunch. Steve Bain, who formerly attended Calvin, and Northwest University's volleyball team will be serving street tacos, and the Ahinas will share about a new water treatment project in Chalmuch, Yucatan that will potentially benefit thousands of people. A freewill offering will be taken at the lunch. Come to learn how you can support the project by praying, volunteering, and giving!
