Suggested Questions for Individual Study or Group Discussion*



- What comes to mind when you think about the Ten Commandments?
- Read Exodus 19:1-8. What commitment is the LORD making to the people? How do the people respond, and to what do they commit?
- What does it mean that the Israelites were to be for God a priestly kingdom and a holy nation? How are followers of Jesus to be similar today (cf. 1 Pe. 2:9-10; Rev. 5:9-10)?
- Read Exodus 20:1-17. How does the first command inform and undergird all the rest? What purpose or role were these instructions to play in the life of Israel?
- What purpose or role does the Law play for followers of Jesus today (cf. Mt. 5:17-20; Jn. 1:16-17)? How does God's Law function in your life and faith?
- Read Exodus 24:3–8. As the covenant commitment is sealed and confirmed, what parts do the LORD and the Israelites each play? Where is the blood splattered, and what does it signify?
- How does the covenant commitment sealed by Jesus relate to what Moses witnessed (cf. Mt. 26:27–29; Heb. 9:19–22, 27–28)? How have you participated in that covenant relationship with Jesus?
- What commitments has the LORD God made to you? What do you commit to do in response? How will you embrace these commitments this week? How can your small group or others support and pray for you as you do this?
