March 2024 Finance Summary

// Please keep Calvin finances and budgeting in prayer

March contributions were quite light, so our financial picture is a little concerning. There's currently over a \$60,000 gap between what we hoped to have in income and what we have actually received to date. As more people move to annual gifts from their IRAs, there's a greater variation in overall giving month to month. This makes budgeting a bit more tricky. As we are currently in the midst of planning budgets for next year, we could use your prayers! Pray for wisdom and discernment.

Fortunately, expenses have been lower due to unfilled staff positions. And God has always been faithful to provide for us through your generosity.

If you have unmet pledges, or if you're planning to give only one time this year to Calvin, please consider making sure we receive that donation before the end of our fiscal year in June. Thank you!

// Here's a look at the numbers for July 2023 – March 2024:

- General Fund Contributions: \$435,934 (our budget hoped for \$497,000);
- Facilities Revenue: \$62,740 (considerably better than our budgeted \$51,400);
- Other Revenue: \$42,360;
- Total Operations Revenue: \$541.034;
- Total Expenses: \$573,044 (giving to missions: \$66,253);
- NET REVENUE: \$(32,910); and
- Total Assets: \$955,088.

First quarter contribution statements were mailed out this past Thursday. Please let us know if you do not receive your giving statement within a few days. As always, if you have any financial questions or concerns, please reach out to Kirsty Haining or to Dan Coppin, head of the Finance Team.




