Suggested Questions for Individual Study or Group Discussion\*



- When and how did you first hear about Jesus Christ and the Gospel? What made it good news to you?
- *Read Acts 2:1–39.* How would you summarize the events of this Pentecost Day? Who are the main characters, and what roles does each one play?
- As the Spirit-filled disciples of Jesus spoke in the myriad languages of the assembled pilgrims, what do you imagine they were saying? How might you have responded if you were there, too?
- What are the main points of Peter’s proclamation about Jesus? How does this specifically speak to his audience? Why would this be considered good news?
- How does Peter share about his own experience with Jesus? Why is this significant?
- In your own words, how does Peter challenge the people to respond to the Gospel he has proclaimed? Who is to be included? How will this change their lives?
- In what ways is Peter an example for how we might proclaim the good news about Jesus to others today?
- How does our church currently proclaim the gospel of salvation for humankind? What do we do well, and where can we improve?
- What can you do this week to proclaim the Gospel in words and actions? How can your small group or others support and pray for you as you do this?
