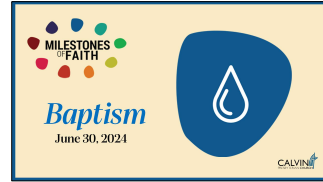

Suggested Questions for Individual
Study or Group Discussion*



- If you have been baptized, how has your baptism been significant in your relationship with Jesus Christ? If you have not been baptized, what factors have kept you from being baptized?
- *Read Acts 2:36–41.* In response to what God has done through Jesus, what are the people called upon to do? How are these different actions related? What might be the reason for each?
- What are the stated and/or implied promises about what God will continue to do for the people? How is this reassuring?
- Who is included in the promise the Lord makes through Peter's declaration? Why is this significant?
- What do you believe God does in and through the Sacrament of Baptism? How is this a comfort and/or a challenge to you?
- If you are baptized, how can you remember God's gift to you in your baptism more frequently, and how could this nourish your faith? If you are not baptized, what might the Lord be inviting you to do next in response to what he has done for you?
- When a child is baptized in our church, the members promise to guide and nurture that child, encouraging him or her to know and follow Christ. What are some concrete ways we do this now and can do this even better in the future? What can you or your small group do in the coming weeks?
- What questions do you still have about baptism, and about its role in the Church and in your own life?
