Hacker Alert!

// Be on the lookout for suspicious emails

This week we experienced a new form of fraud. A hacker installed himself into the middle of an email conversation between Christi Nixon and a guest user. The beginning of the email thread was from Christi. But then the hacker stepped in, creating a look-alike email and of course calling himself "Christi Nixon." He copied the email history to make the new email look legitimate, and then the hacker started corresponding with the quest user. Christi was completely unaware of this new conversation. The scammer tricked the quest user into sending money to his own account. Although, of course, at the time, the guest user thought she was making a payment for using space at Calvin.

This attack was particularly insidious because it started in the middle of a legitimate conversation. In hindsight, the

telltale signs were there — the tone changed, the wording became more abrupt and there was no use of punctuation. But we certainly haven't been on the lookout to have a real email conversation suddenly turn into a fake one.

If something seems a little off, the best thing you can do is contact the staff member (or your friend or whomever you think you're talking to) — but be sure to do so using a different form of communication. If the email makes you hesitate, pick up the phone or send a text. If a text seems weird, make a phone call.

Here are some friendly email safety reminders:

- Change your email password every few years;
- Do not use the same password for multiple accounts;
- Poor grammar, misspelled words, and lack of punctuation are giveaways of scam emails;
- Double check the actual email addresses and make sure they are the right email addresses (especially when the conversation is about sending gift cards or money); and
- Unless you know the sender, do not open any attachments.
