July 2024 Finance Summary

// New fiscal year begins

Thank you all for your prayers and financial support of Calvin and our shared ministries!

We are at the beginning of a new fiscal year. Session approved the new budget in mid-July. In keeping with our slight drop in income, this year's budget is a bit more modest than last year, but we are in good shape for the year to come. Calvin's financial position remains sound.

Expenses were greater than our income during July. Thankfully, we actually anticipated having a small deficit at this point. As far as our budget goes, we have matched and slightly exceeded what we hoped to receive in

General Fund contributions for July. That is terrific news for the start of a new fiscal year! We give thanks to God for his faithfulness in providing for our congregation's needs.

As we begin this new fiscal year, there have been some changes to the way restricted accounts are managed. Session voted last Fall to consolidate our various restricted funds into larger categories, making the funds more accessible for current needs. When you receive your third quarter contribution statements in October, you might notice that some of the account names are slightly different.

// Here are the numbers for July:

- General Fund Contributions: \$46,457 (on target for our budgeted income of \$46,000);
- Facilities Revenue: \$4,882 (also better than our budgeted \$4,000);
- Other Revenue: \$4,340;
- Total Operations Revenue: \$55,679;
- Total Expenses: \$62,496 (giving to missions: \$5,322);
- Net Revenue: \$(6,817); and
- Total Assets: \$930,107.
