October Finance Summary

// Financial stewardship for 2025

October donations remain steady, if not as strong as a year ago at this time; Calvin is still running a deficit. General fund income is currently at 93% of what we budgeted. The good news is that we are still doing

better than we anticipated at this point in the fiscal year. Facilities income has been strong and our expenses have been under budget.

// Numbers for July - October

- General Fund Contributions: \$177,164 (93% of our targeted income of \$190,000);
- Facilities Revenue: \$41,592 (way ahead of our budgeted \$25,250);
- Other Revenue: \$18,324;
- **Total Operations Revenue:** \$237,080;
- Total Expenses: \$269,641 (giving to missions: \$24,462);
- Net Revenue: \$(32,561);
- Total Assets: \$926,413.
