

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# LECTIO DIVINA

A prayerful reading with mind and heart

### Silencio (Silence)

- Prepare for spiritual reading by finding a place where you can focus on God and his loving presence.
- With each breath, breathe in the Holy Spirit, and breathe out distractions. Inwardly shift from only reading the text to allowing the text to read you.

### **Lectio** (Reading) — Read your text for the first time.

- Note words or phrases that draw your attention and allow words that are weighty with meaning to sink in and nourish your soul.
- Return to what attracts or repulses you, what is comforting or uncomfortable.
- The question behind our reading is, "What are you saying to me right now. Lord?"

## **Meditatio** (Meditation) – Read your text for the second time.

- Gently repeat to yourself the word or phrase to which you have been drawn, reflecting upon the thoughts, hopes, images and feelings that come to you.
- Pay attention: What does the text elicit in you?

# **Oratio** (Prayer) — Read your text for the third time.

- Respond to what you have read and heard from God to this point as the Lord has addressed you through the Word.
- Pray whatever naturally flows out of your heart. Honestly express your deepest thoughts, feelings, and desires in dialogue with God.

## **Contemplatio** (Contemplation) — Rest completely in God.

- Be receptive to whatever God wants to do in you, with you, and through you.
- With gratitude and abandonment, yield to God without expectations or demands. Enjoy the divine presence.

# INDUCTIVE STUDY

Questions for Individuals or Group Discussion

#### **PRAY**

Before you read, pray that the Holy Spirit will grace you with eyes to see and ears to hear whatever the Lord has for you today.

#### **READ**

Read your text slowly. If needed, read earlier portions of the gospel to get the context. If helpful, read your text in several translations.

### **OBSERVATIONS** — What does the text say?

- Who is present in this passage? What do you know about them?
- What is happening? What is being said or done by whom?
- When and where do the events take place?
- Where is there narrative tension? What situation is addressed?

#### **INTERPRETATIONS** — What does the text mean?

- What is the context? How does this fit in the gospel story?
- How would you summarize the dialogue and/or actions?
- · What promises, truths, commands, or warnings are given?
- What does this text say to us about our Lord?

### **APPLICATIONS** — What does the text mean to us?

- What is our Lord saying to you through this passage?
- How is the situation in the gospel like situations in our lives? How does the message of this text apply to us today?
- What does God want you to know or do in response to this message?
  How will you live this out tomorrow?

#### **PRAY**

Ask God to help you respond faithfully to what you are hearing the Lord say to you and/or your group.
