March Finance Summary

// Ask God to supply what we need for this year and next!

Thank you all for your generosity to Calvin Church! Although we did not meet our goal for contributions in March, our year-todate net revenue is still better than anticipated. Our year-to-date deficit is \$34,586, compared to our budgeted deficit of \$55,181 at this point in time. So, we are continuing to do well even as we operate on a deficit budget this year. We are grateful to God for his provision, and to all of you for your faithful giving.

We are in the midst of budget season! Please continue to pray for wisdom and discernment for all who are involved in the budget process. We do want to fully fund our ministries, mission partners, and personnel, but we also want to be responsive to how the Spirit is moving here at Calvin. Where do we need to expand, and where do we need to prune? Pray that we might listen in humility to God's direction for Calvin's future. The numbers for July–March:

- General Fund Contributions \$462,428 (our target for this month was \$474,000);
- Facilities Revenue \$72,116 (still stronger than our budgeted \$64,750);
- Other Revenue \$40,457;
- Total Operations Revenue \$575,001;
- Total Expenses \$609,587 (giving to missions: \$56,982);
- NET REVENUE \$(34,586); and
- Total Assets \$899,863.

First quarter contribution statements were mailed out on Thursday. If you do not receive your statement within the next few days, or if you have any financial questions or concerns, please be sure to contact <u>Kirsty</u> in the church office. Rhythms of Grace Begins Today

// Connect with Christ

Rhythms are all around us in nature — in the seasons, tides, and the rising and setting sun. Rhythms are inside us too — in our breathing, circulation, waking and sleeping. Rhythms can be part of the spiritual life too as regular and recurring practices join us with God's redemptive love in action.

In Calvin's new *Rhythms of Grace* workshops, we will explore intentional rhythms to grow in God's grace and to be increasingly saturated and transformed by it. Time-tested practices will provide structure and direction to grow us as disciples of Jesus as we engage them individually and corporately. Each person's rhythms will be tailored to cooperate with the work God's Spirit is already doing in their life at their particular life stage.

Connecting with Christ is the first part of our three-part series of Rhythms of Grace. In this segment, we will learn ways we can get to know Jesus and abide with him. We will see how to be with Jesus in the daily and mundane parts of life, how to hear the Living Word speak through the written word of God, and how to find Christ in times of transition or darkness. We will experiment with practices of contemplative prayer, Lectio Divina, communal discernment, lament, celebration and more.
