// Dean Rowley dies

Dean Rowley, a retired pastor (Ray Riese preached at his ordination service!) and active at Calvin while he lived at Cristwood Park, died on Sunday, May 18, 2025, at the age of 95. His memorial service will take place in Oregon at the Presbyterian church where he served before retirement.

#### **April Finance Summary**

// Pray for wisdom in Calvin's budget process

April contributions were slightly more than our budget hoped for, bringing our year-to-date revenue up to 98% of our target. Even though we have not reached the YTD budget goal for contributions, our net revenue continues to be better than anticipated. The general fund deficit now is \$43,472, compared to our projected April deficit of \$55,878. As you know, we are operating on a deficit budget this year, but Calvin remains financially sound. We are grateful to God for his provision, and to all of you for your faithful giving.

We are in the midst of budget season, and so we covet your prayers at this time. Our budget is looking not only to the coming fiscal year, but also at how Calvin will fare three to five years down the line. The goal of this process is to discern what God wants us to do and how to use the resources he provides.

Please pray that we might listen in humility to God's direction for Calvin's future and seek out ways to bless the community where we've been planted. May we be good stewards of the funds you entrust to us, and may we all abide in Christ, loving and encouraging one another in him.

// Here are the numbers for July 2024 – April 2025

- General Fund Contributions: \$519,437 — our target for this month was \$529,000;
- Facilities Revenue: \$75,372 a bit better than our budgeted \$73,250;
- Other Revenue: \$44,950;
- Total Operations Revenue: \$639,759;
- Total Expenses: \$683,231 giving to missions: \$62,335;
- GF Net Revenue: \$(43,472); and
- Total Assets: \$888,475.

He has always been faithful in providing for our congregation's needs.

#### **Walk for Water Report**

// Thank you to all who participated and donated

About 30 folks joined our "Calvin for Kenya" team, raising \$6,125 for clean water or solar power. The amount Calvin raised will purchase four rain catchment tanks for families in rural Kenya so that four women will no longer have to walk several

hours to find water that might still be polluted. Or these same funds might be used to purchase solar panels, so that seven families will have electric lights to allow kids to do homework or moms to work on incomegenerating projects after the sun has set. Altogether, the Walk for Water teams collected \$102,003 this year to provide for the needs of Kenyan families.
