Calvin enjoys using our building to support the community. We feel that it's important to host a group like AA DRU, so we give them a generous discount and do not charge any hosting fees, as we would with other groups.

Calvin is currently looking for more volunteer hosts to join the AA DRU team. Hosts are there to provide a friendly welcome to the attendees, and stay until the group leaves to lock up the church.
