September Finance Summary

// Slow start to fiscal year, but overall finances are healthy

Contributions to the General Fund through September continue to be a bit low, although since many people have moved to giving annual gifts we find that budgeting is not as predictable as in the past.

Currently, we are at 85% of our budget target for income. Fortunately, because expenses were also a bit lower than anticipated, our net revenue — a deficit — is only about \$2K more than where we anticipated our budget would be at this point in the fiscal year.

Facilities revenue continues to be stellar. As we mentioned last month, this is in part due to the pre-payment of one of our longterm guest users. But there is also increased revenue, which is good news for our budget.

- Facilities Revenue: \$28,473 better than expected due to pre-payment;
- Other Revenue: \$11.745:
- Total Operations Revenue: \$167,529;
- Total Expenses: \$199,291 giving to missions: \$20,040;
- GF Net Revenue: \$(31,762); and
- Total Assets: \$905,894.

// New furnace supplies music rooms and SW offices

Last week we had a new furnace installed, supplying the heat to several high-traffic areas, including the choir room, music office, community engagement office, and facilities office. Christi was surprised to get a draft of warm air coming through the vents in their office — the first time that had happened in the ten years they've occupied that space!

We knew the furnace was in bad shape — it was over 30 years old and had excessive wear and tear — but we hadn't realized just how poorly it had been performing.

While we are extremely happy to have heat at that end of the building, this is but the "tip of the iceberg." In the next five years, we hope to replace 12 more furnaces, another water heater, and our building's main roof.

Capital expenses for our building and grounds are typically funded through reserve funds and special gifts. Your continual, faithful financial support of our facilities is very much needed and appreciated!
