Our Calvin Staff Is Growing!

In a gracious answer to our prayers, God has brought us two people to be a part of our Calvin Church staff, filling temporary half-time positions during a season of leadership transition. Curtis White will take on the role of Interim Director of Family Ministries while Patrick Meagher will serve as our Interim Minister of Congregational Care.

// Introducing Curtis

You may have already met Rev. Curtis White, as he has been giving leadership to Messy Church this fall. Curtis is an ordained PC(USA) minister who has recently moved back to our area after serving as the pastor of a church in Macon, GA. Previously he served at First Presbyterian Church of Snohomish directing their youth ministries. Curtis was excited about having his family participate in Messy Church, and upon hearing that we needed someone to serve as our Messy Church Coordinator, he enthusiastically volunteered.

Believing that God was up to something good, the Session engaged with Curtis in conversation about taking on a broader role in leading our Calvin families in their Christian faith formation. A 20-hour/week position of Interim Director of Family Ministries was created and approved, and a hiring team commissioned by the Session worked through a process with Curtis to discern together if this

was God's leading. And we agreed that indeed it was! Curtis officially began as our Interim Family Ministries Director on November 1.

If you haven't already, we hope you all will have a chance to meet Curtis, his wife, Brianna, and their sons Elias and Marcus. When you do, please extend them a warm welcome.

// Introducing Patrick

Needing to ensure we had ongoing leadership for our various caring ministries, the Session worked through the summer to create a 20hour/week position of Interim Minister of Congregational Care. This position will coordinate and engage in visitation of those with acute needs like a hospitalization or death of a family member; ensure that our homebound members are cared for; and support the ministry of our Deacons. After reviewing applicants, Patrick Meagher ("MAW-her") emerged as clear choice for the hiring team.

Patrick comes to us with nearly two decades of experience serving at Phinney Ridge Lutheran Church where home and hospital visitation comprised a consistent feature of his roles. This ministry included conversation, communion, prayer, and simply meeting each person's individual needs for care and connection. He holds a Masters of Arts in Christian Studies from The Seattle School of Theology and Psychology, and he is currently working to complete a Certificate in Scripture & Society from there as well. While Patrick is in his own transitional season as a minister, we are excited and grateful that God has brought him to serve our congregation.

Patrick begins his role as Interim Minister of Congregational Care on Monday, November 10. When you meet Patrick, know that he is passionate about social justice and serving the marginalized, is a self-described "baseball fanatic" and Mariners fan, and a diehard fan of the band U2 (ask him how many of their shows he's seen!).
