November Finance Summary

// General Fund is a bit under target, but still healthy

As we come to the end of 2025 and anticipate Christmas, we give thanks for the financial blessings God has showered upon Calvin through your generosity. Although General Fund contributions did not meet our budget goal for November, we are still in a sound position for the current fiscal year. Facilities revenue remains very

strong, and overall revenue, including giving to restricted funds, puts us above budget targets. Expenses are about what we expected, and our "bottom line" in assets has strengthened as compared to last month.

Even so, giving during this month of December is critical to fully funding our ministries. As we mentioned last week in the Friday email, "it is a truth universally acknowledged" that all charities rely on December contributions to remain strong. Please consider a special yearend gift to Calvin. For whatever you have done and are able to do, thank you.

// Here are the numbers for July – November 2025

- General Fund Contributions: \$254,564 - 97% of target income:
- Facilities Revenue: \$47,687 still going strong;
- Other Revenue: \$17.201:
- Total Operations Revenue: \$319,452;
- Total Expenses: \$328,338 giving to missions: \$31,205;
- GF Net Revenue: \$(8,886); and
- Total Assets: \$991,413.

Vision House Partnership

// Diversion Center entry team

Vision House has a thoughtful process when an individual or family contacts them for support. It starts with an initial

phone call with the entry team that includes a determination about whether the person/family should be on the Active Participation List or the Active Diversion List.

- Active Participation: A family waiting for transitional housing is connected to resources to prepare for potential entry into the Family Program. Participants in the Family Program eventually graduate into the Alumni Program.
- Active Diversion: A single person or two adults with no children will be helped with a job and housing search.

Connections begin with listening, learning, and loving like Jesus did. That is exactly what the Diversion Center entry team does when they determine how best to help the people who seek them out for care.
