Suggested Questions for Individual Study or Group Discussion*



- When you think about the future, what makes you feel hopeful?
- Read 1 Peter 1:1-12. What can you deduce about those to whom Peter writes? What is the situation of his letter's recipients?
- What evidence do you see of all three members of the Trinity?
 What descriptions or actions are attached to each?
- According to Peter, what has God already done for these believers? How might this affect what they believe about themselves and their situation? How would understanding their God-given identity give them hope?
- What promises does Peter give for their future? How would this also give them hope?
- What purpose does Peter see in the suffering his readers are enduring (v. 6-7)?
- When have trials brought about the testing of your faith? How was your faith refined by this experience? How do you see Jesus differently now?
- Of Peter's many references to what God has already done and still promises to do for us, which stands out to you the most or speaks to your circumstances today? Why? How does this give you hope?
- With your words and actions, how can you give praise, glory and honor to the Triune God this week (v. 3, 7)? How can your small group or others pray for you and join you in this?
